Our 14th Annual "Discover the Silent City – Oak Grove Cemetery Tour" was held on Saturday, September 14th. Over 250 people attended this year's tour which focused on "La Crosse – The Civil War Years Part III". In addition to our public tour, Oak Grove Cemetery is host to over 600 middle school students during the tour week. They participate in a student version of the "Discover the Silent City" tour. ***As many of you know**, the Losey Memorial Arch is over 100 years old and was in need of restoration. The cost to restore the arch to its original appearance was astronomical. Therefore, Oak Grove Cemetery chose to "preserve" the arch in its present state. The project was completed in the summer of 2013. The preservation process slows down the effects of Mother

***A bit of sad news ...** Oak Grove Cemetery was struck by vandalism in August of 2013. A total of 60 monuments were pushed over. Due to granite being a very hard material, the majority of the monuments weren't damaged, but the work involved by the Oak Grove Cemetery crew to reset all of these monuments was tremendous. The vandalism was reported to the police and the local news media did a great job of telling our "story". If anyone has information regarding this vandalism, it can reported to the La Crosse Police Dept. "Crime Stoppers" division.
